Colusa East/West & Princeton Community Meeting - February 13

You are invited to participate in a community meeting to identify and address flood problems and potential solutions to protect your community. Properties located north of the City of Colusa, on both sides of the river and up to the County line (including the community of Princeton) are at risk of potential flooding from the Sacramento River and the Colusa Basin Drain. The County is partnering with other local governments and agencies to identify the area's flood risks, along with projects and programs to reduce that risk. The work is being done as part of the Mid and Upper Sacramento River Regional Flood Management Plan. The plan, to be completed by the end of 2014, will prioritize flood risk reduction projects for future state and federal funding. Your help is needed to identify projects for your area.
